GIST OF COMPLAINT: On Tuesday, October 31, 2017, at about 2:30PM, Public Integrity Bureau Commander Gwendolyn Nolan, directed Investigator Arlen Barnes to review an e-mail complaint received via the OCDM/DOJ (Office of the Consent Decree Monitor / Department of Justice), regarding N.O.P.D. item # I-30045-17 & I-30056-17. The e-mail, dated October 30, 2017, was authored by Mr. Matt Seagraves, Compliance Manager, of the N.O.P.D. Compliance Bureau. The e-mail indicated the following:

"OCDM and DOJ are concerned about this one. They don't think the officers had PC to conduct a strip search. The Lt. who was involved in the case approved the strip search. They think it was a cavity search (not a strip search) and should have had a search warrant. They don't think the officers had PC to search the kid in the car at the time of the stop.

The admin sgt approved the epr which was created by the Lt."

Investigator Barnes reviewed the attachments included in the e-mail complaint which was recorded under item I-30056-17. One of the attachments was a copy of a Traffic Affidavit #J869655, which documented the arrest of Mr. William Bailey, of 2533 Gravier St., New Orleans, La. 70119, for violation of traffic statues R.S. 32:295 (Child Scat Belt Required Usage) and R.S. 32:295.1, (Seat Belt Required Usage) under N.O.P.D. Item I-30045-17. The affidavit indicated the arrest took place on Saturday, September 23, 2017, at 11:53AM; the violation occurred at the intersection of Orleans Ave. & N. Rocheblave St. Officer Frank Vitrano, assigned to the F.O.B. First District, was listed as the affiant. Lieutenant John O'Brien was listed as the supervisor who authorized the arrest of Mr. William Bailey.

The investigator obtained a copy of the N.O.P.D. Field Interview authored by Officer Vitrano of the detention of William Bailey under item I-30045-17.

The investigator also obtained a copy of the N.O.P.D. arrest report recorded under N.O.P.D. item I-30056-17. The report was classified as a signal 966 – Drug Law Violation which occurred on Saturday, September 23, 2017, at 11:53AM. The arrest location was indicated as the 2200 block of Orleans Ave. The Offender section indicated Mr. William Bailey, of 25 Gravier St., New Orleans, La. 70119 was arrested by Lieutenant John O'Brien, assigned to the F.O.B. First District.

The report indicated Bailey was charged with violation of R.S. 40:967, Prohibited Acts – Schedule II Drugs: Relative to Possession with Intent to Distribute a Schedule Two Controlled Dangerous Substance to wit: Crack Cocaine (Several Rocks, Approx. 5.1 Grams). He was also charged with La. R.S. 14:91.13, Illegal Use of a C.D.S. in Minor Presence: Relative to possession of a Controlled Dangerous Substance in the Presence of a Minor (6 year old male child).

The offender section of the report indicated Mr. William Bailey had a Texas Driver's License (23947488) at the time of his arrest. Officer Frank Vitrano was listed as the transporting officer. Sergeant Stephanie Taillon, badge 290, was listed as the approving supervisor.

The narrative of the report indicated Lieutenant O'Brien, assisted by Officers Frank Vitrano, Anita McKay and Brianne Verrett; arrested Mr. William Bailey for the aforementioned narcotics and traffic violations. Lieutenant O'Brien indicated at the time of the arrest he was attired in plain clothes and operated a surveillance vehicle. The assisting officers were attired in N.O.P.D. (short sleeve) uniforms with Body Worn Cameras and operated marked police vehicles equipped with Mobile Video Units.

The report indicated on Friday, September 22, 2017, Lieutenant O'Brien obtained a Search Warrant from Criminal District Court to search a 2016 Nissan Maxima, white in color, bearing La. license plate 511 AUT.

The report indicated on the morning of Saturday, September 23, 2017, he relocated to the area of Orleans Ave. & S. Galvez St. to conduct a pre-search warrant surveillance of the Nissan Maxima. He indicated he had previous information and knowledge the vehicle and target of the investigation (William Bailey) frequented the area where he would sell illicit narcotics, and store drugs in the vehicle. He informed Officer Vitrano his intentions were to observe William Bailey in or near the vehicle; then directing Officer Vitrano to conduct a take-down stop in order to conduct a search of the vehicle.

The report indicated on Saturday, September 23, 2017, at about 11:00AM, he observed the unoccupied Nissan Maxima parked in the 2200 block of Orleans Ave. He conducted a surveillance of the vehicle until 11:50AM, when he observed a subject fitting the description of Bailey enter the vehicle, and drive away. He noted the driver was not wearing his seat belt. He radioed the vehicle's path of travel to Officer Vitrano, who located the vehicle and conducted a traffic stop.

The report indicated Officer Vitrano came in contact with the driver of the vehicle, (William Bailey) and a male child (Bailey's nephew) who was standing unrestrained in the front passenger seat of the vehicle. Officer Vitrano handcuffed Bailey, conducted a "pat down" for weapons, and then placed him in the rear of his police vehicle. Officer Vitrano advised Mr. Bailey of his Miranda rights and told him Lieutenant O'Brien would apprise him of the investigation.

The report indicated Lieutenant O'Brien, while on scene, instructed Officer Anita McKay to check the small child (Bailey's nephew) before turning the child over to a relative. The report indicated the reason for the search was "due to Lieutenant O'Brien's prior experience in narcotic investigations where drug dealers would conceal contraband on small children in the belief that police officers won't search small children". Officer McKay searched the small child, which yielded no contraband being found. The report also indicated the child was released to an unidentified family member who arrived on scene.

The report indicated Lieutenant O'Brien instructed Officer Verrett to relocate the Nissan Maxima to the First District Police Station's sally port located at conduct at 501 N. Rampart St. Officer Vitrano transported Bailey to the First District Station. Lieutenant O'Brien showed the search warrant to Bailey and explained the investigation to him. He informed Bailey that he would be provided with a copy of the search warrant and a handwritten inventory on the rear of the warrant for any confiscated items. Bailey remained in the lobby area of the station, with Officer Vitrano, while Lieutenant O'Brian and Officer Verrett searched the Nissan Maxima. After approximately an hour into the search, no contraband was found.

The report indicated "based on Lieutenant O'Brien's previous information on Bailey, in addition to his experience in street level illegal drug activity, Lieutenant O'Brien had a strong reason to believe that Bailey was concealing contraband within his inner clothing garments. Based on that Lieutenant O'Brien decided to perform a strip search on Bailey per N.O.P.D. Policy 1.2.4".

The report indicated Lieutenant O'Brian explained to Bailey a strip search would be conducted. Lieutenant O'Brien, along with Officer Vitrano and Officer Arthur Cleveland, escorted Bailey to the men's locker room located inside of the police station. Officer Vitrano's Body Worn Camera was activated. Officer Cleveland utilized a Departmental digital camera in record mode during the escort and search of Bailey.

The report indicated Lieutenant O'Brien located \$612.00 in various denominations in Bailey's right rear pants pocket. The report also indicated "Lieutenant O'Brien continued to search Bailey while using a handheld flashlight, all the while being recorded on Officer Vitrano's Body Worn Camera and the Digital Recorder held by Officer Cleveland. As Lieutenant O'Brien held back the rear portion of the inner boxer shorts worn by Bailey, he (O'Brien) could clearly see in plain view a piece of clear plastic paper sticking out between Bailey's buttocks. The paper was sticking out approximately a half-inch. Upon observing the plastic paper, Lieutenant O'Brien instructed Bailey to spread his legs further and not to clinch his buttocks. Lieutenant O'Brien removed the plastic with his right hand and immediately observed it was a small clear wrapped bag containing what appeared to be several small pieces of crack cocaine. Lieutenant O'Brien dropped the bag on the locker room floor and instructed Officer Cleveland to record the bag".

The report indicated, "Lieutenant O'Brien asked Bailey if he had anything else on his person, in which Bailey did not answer. Lieutenant O'Brien believed that Bailey may have had additional contraband hidden on his person. At that point Lieutenant O'Brien and Officer Vitrano removed Bailey's boxer shorts completely. Lieutenant O'Brien, with the aid of the handheld flashlight, visually checked under Bailey's genitals for any additional contraband in which no further contraband was found".

The report indicated the contraband was field tested by Officer Vitrano and Lieutenant O'Brien, which showed a positive test result for cocaine. He also indicated he conducted a handwritten inventory of the confiscated items on the rear of the search warrant which was provided to Bailey.

The report indicated Officer Vitrano completed a traffic affidavit charging Bailey with traffic violations of no seat belt and no child restraint. The affidavit was reviewed and signed by Lieutenant O'Brien.

The report indicated Lieutenant O'Brien completed a handwritten arrest gist which was reviewed and signed by Sergeant Stephanie Taillon. The report also indicated Sergeant Taillon assisted Lieutenant O'Brien in preparing the interoffice correspondence for the strip search policy.

The investigator reviewed the handwritten gist authored by Lieutenant O'Brien and approved by Sergeant Taillon. The gist indicated Bailey was arrested following a traffic stop of a vehicle which was the target of a search warrant. The gist did not explain the justification for the "strip search" or the reason Bailey was charged with Illegal Use of a Controlled Dangerous Substance in the Presence of a Minor.

The investigator reviewed Officer Frank Vitrano's Body Worn Camera footage of the traffic stop and subsequent arrest of William Bailey. The footage confirmed Officer Vitrano was directed by Lieutenant O'Brien to stop the vehicle being operated by William Bailey. Lieutenant O'Brian came to the location of the stop and instructed Officer Vitrano to place Bailey in the rear of his patrol vehicle and inform him of his Miranda warnings and the narcotics investigation and the search warrant for the vehicle. Officer Vitrano's Body Worn Camera Footage also confirmed he assisted Lieutenant O'Brien conduct the strip search of William Bailey.

The investigator reviewed Officer Anita McKay's Body Worn Camera footage of the search of the child, who identified himself as "Terrance". The footage confirmed Officer McKay was directed to search the child by Lieutenant O'Brien.

The investigator reviewed the Application for a Search Warrant and Order of Search obtained by Lieutenant O'Brien for the 2016 Nissan Maxima bearing La. License 511 AUT. The Return on Search Warrant indicated \$612.00 and a clear bag containing several pieces of rock substances (5.1GM) were seized pursuant to the Search Warrant.

Based on the information reviewed, a Formal Disciplinary Investigation was initiated to determine if Lieutenant John O'Brien violated Rule 2: Moral Conduct; Paragraph 1, Adherence to law to wit: Rule 2: Moral Conduct; Paragraph 1, Adherence to law to wit: RS 14:46, Relative to False Imprisonment by conducting a strip and / or body cavity search of William Bailey which resulted in his arrest for violation of R.S. 40:967, Prohibited Acts – Schedule II Drugs: Relative to Possession with Intent to Distribute a Schedule Two Controlled Dangerous Substance to wit: Crack Cocaine (Several Rocks, Approx. 5.1 Grams). He was also charged with La. R.S. 14:91.13, Illegal Use of a C.D.S. in Minor Presence: Relative to possession of a Controlled Dangerous Substance in the Presence of a Minor under N.O.P.D. item number I-30056-17.

The investigation should also determine if Lieutenant John O'Brien violated Rule 4: Performance of Duty; Paragraph 4, Neglect of Duty, Subparagraph c-6; failing to comply with instructions, oral or written, from any authoritative source to wit: Policy 344.1.1 Report Preparation by failing to document justification for the search of the six year old child (Terrance) and justification for the strip search of William Bailey in the incident report recorded under item I-30056-17. The investigation should also determine why Lieutenant O'Brien listed the monies and narcotics found during the strip search of William Bailey on the Return of Search Warrant. The investigation should also determine why the six year old child (Terrance) was not listed as the victim in the incident report.

The investigation should also determine if Lieutenant John O'Brien violated Rule 4: Performance of Duty; Paragraph 4, Neglect of Duty, Subparagraph c-6; failing to comply with instructions, oral or written, from any authoritative source to wit: Chapter 1.2.4 Search and Seizure, Paragraph 47, Strip Searches. Subparagraph (a) states: The officer shall obtain written authorization from his or her supervisor prior to the strip search, and the supervisor shall be on-scene at all times during the search. Subparagraph (k) states: Strip searches shall not be video recorded or photographed unless required for evidentiary reasons and specifically authorized in writing, in advance, by a supervisor. The investigation should determine why Lieutenant O'Brien did not obtain written authorization from a supervisor to conduct a strip search of William Bailey and have the supervisor present at the scene when the strip search was conducted. The investigation should also determine why Lieutenant O'Brien did not obtain written authorization to video record the strip search of William Bailey.

The investigation should also determine if Lieutenant John O'Brien violated Rule 4: Performance of Duty; Paragraph 4, Neglect of Duty, Subparagraph c-6; failing to comply with instructions, oral or written, from any authoritative source to wit: Chapter 1.2.4 Search and Seizure, Paragraph 51, Body Cavity Searches. The investigation should determine if Lieutenant O'Brien conducted a Body Cavity Search of William Bailey without obtaining a search warrant in accordance with Departmental policy.

The investigation should also determine if Lieutenant John O'Brien violated Rule 4: Performance of Duty; Paragraph 4, Neglect of Duty, Subparagraph (b); An employee with supervisory responsibility shall be in neglect of duty whenever he fails to properly supervise subordinates, or when his actions in matters relating to discipline fail to conform with the dictates of Departmental Rules, Policies and Procedures to wit: Chapter 1.9 Arrests — Paragraph 12 Supervisor's Responsibilities — The Supervisor shall approve the officer's arrest recommendation based on the existence of probable cause and consistency with NOPD regulations (Traffic Affidavit #J869655). The investigation should determine if William Bailey should have been issued a traffic summons in lieu if arrest in accordance with N.O.P.D. Policy 516 — Traffic Citations, Procedure 516.4 and Article 211 of the La. Criminal Code of Procedure (summons by officer instead of arrest and booking) under item I-30045-17.

The investigation should also determine if Lieutenant John O'Brien violated Rule 4: Performance of Duty; Paragraph 4, Neglect of Duty, Subparagraph (b); An employee with supervisory responsibility shall be in neglect of duty whenever he fails to properly supervise subordinates, or when his actions in matters relating to discipline fail to conform with the dictates of Departmental Rules, Policies and Procedures to wit: Chapter 1.2.4 Search and Seizure, Paragraph 5, Search & Seizures. The investigation should determine if Lieutenant O'Brien had justification to instruct Officer Anita McKay to search a child "Terrance" for illicit narcotics before releasing the child to a relative.

The investigation should determine if Sergeant Taillon approved the gist and subsequent incident report authored by Lieutenant John O'Brien with did not contain justification for the strip search and arrest of William Bailey under N.O.P.D. item I-30056-17.





LIEUTENANT O'BRIEN AFFORDED HIMSELE WITH A STATIONARY SURVEILLANCE POSITION WITH A CLEAR AND UNDESTRUCTED VIEW TOWNINGS THE TARGET VEHICLE: APPROXIMATELY (10) MINUTES INTO THE SURVEILLANCE, LIEUTENANT O'BRIEN O'BSERVED A BLACK MALE SUBJECT WALKING DOWN O'RLEANS AVENUE AND TURNED RIGHT ONTO SOUTH GALVEZ STREET.

LIEUTENANT O'BRIEN OND NOT GET A GOOD LOOK AT THAT SUBJECT, BUT BELIEVED IT MAY HAVE BEEN WILLIAM BAILEY, LIEUTENANT O'BRIEN, WHO MAINTAINED CONSTANT HADIO TRANSLUSSION WITH O'FFICER VITRANO ON A SPERATE TALK CHANNEL, INSTRUCTED O'FFICER VITRANO TO DO'A FEDESTRIAN STOP ON THAT SUBJECT TO VERIEY IN FACT IT WAS WILLIAM BAILEY, LIEUTENANT O'BRIEN LEFT HIS STATIONARY SURVEIL ANCE POSITION IN ORDER TO GET A VISUAL CONTACT ON THE PEDESTRIAN BELIEVED TO BE WILLIAM BAILEY. THE BALLEY, O'FFICER VITRANO CONDUCTED A PEDESTRIAN STOP ON THAT SUBJECT, BUT VERRIED IT WAS NOT WILLIAM BAILEY. THE SUBJECT WAS SUBSECUENTLY RELEASED WITHOUT INCIDENT. O'FFICER VITRANO LATER ENTERED AN ELECTRONIC FELD INTERVIEW ON THAT SUBJECT.

AFTER THE PEDESTRIAN STOP WAS COMPLETED, LIEUTENANT O'BRIEN RE-LOCATED TO THE AREA AROUND THE 2200 BLOCK OF ORLEANS AVENUE AND ESTABLISHED ANOTHER STATIONARY SURVEILLANCE POSITION WITH A CLEAR AND UNOBSTRUCTED VIEW TOWARDS THE VEHICLE IN CRIESTION, LIEUTENANT O'BRIEN DID NOT USE BINOCULARS DURING THE SURVEILLANCE DUE TO HIS UNOBSTRUCTED VIEW TOWARDS THE MISSAAL

AT APPROXIMATELY 11:50 A.M. (8/23/2017). CIEUTENANT OBRIEN OBSERVED A BLACK MALE BUBIRCY MATCHING THE DESCRIPTION OF WILLIAM BARLEY ENTER THE NISSAN ON THE FROM DRIVER SIDE. LEGITENANT GOBIEN DID NOT SEE WHERE BAILEY HAD CAME FROM PRIOR TO ENTERING THE VEHICLE, BUT APPEARED HE MAY HAVE EXITED A NEARBY RESIDENCE IN THE 2200 BLOCK OF ORLEANS AVENUE. AS BAILEY ENTERED THE NISSAN, HE DROVE CHY DOWN ORLEANS AVENUE AND MADE A ULTURN ONTO THE DOWNTOWN (EAST) SIDE OF ORLEANS AVENUE AND BEGAN TO TRAVEL IN A LAKE (NORTH) DRECTION UP ORLEANS AVENUE. AS THE NISSAN TRAVELED UP ORLEANS AVENUE, LIEUTENANT O'BRIEN COULD CLEARLY SEE THAT THE DRIVER BALLET) WAS NOT WEARING A SEATBELT, LIEUTENANT O'BRIEN RELAYED THE PATH OF TRAVEL TO OFFICER VITRANO, WHO CUICKLY MADE HIS WAY ONTO ORLEANS AVENUE TO CONDUCT A VEHICLE STOP ON THE NISSAN MAXIMA. LIEUTENANT O'BRIEN TOLD OFFICER VITRANO TO SMITCH OVER TO THE OPEN RADIO CHANNEL IN ORDER TO LET OTHER UNITS KNOW ABOUT THE SITUATION AT HAND.

OFFICER VITRANO OBSERVED THE NISSAN TRAVELING UP ORLEANS AVENUE AND ACTIVATED EMERGENCY EQUIPMENT IN ORDER TO PULL THE NISSAN OVER, THE NISSAN, AT A MORIMAL RATE OF SPEED, CONTINUED TO TRAVEL UP ORLEANS AVENUE FOR AFPROXIMATELY 4-6 BLOCKS WITHOUT STOPPING, LIEUTENANT O'BRIEN LEFT HIS STATIONARY SURVENLANCE AND MADE HIS WAY TO THE AREA OF OFFICER VITRANO AND THE MISSAN, THE MISSAN TOCK A LEFT TURN ONTO NORTH ROCHEBLAVE STREET AND CAME TO A 5 For

STOP NEAR THE INTERSECTION OF ORLEANS AVENUE AND NORTH ROCHEDLAVE STREET, AS THE MISSAN CAME TO A STOP, OFFICER VITRANO EXITED AND APPROACHED THE NISSAN. AS OFFICER VITRAND CAME INTO CONTACT WITH THE DRIVER, HE VERBALLY INSTRUCTED HIM TO EXIT AND ASKED FOR HIS NAME. THE DRIVER SAID HIS NAME WAS "WILLIAM" AS HE COMPLIED AND EXITED. OFFICER VITRANO OBSERVED A SMALL BLACK MALE CHILD UNRESTRAINED STANDING ON THE FRONT PASSENGER SIDE SEAT (THE CHILD WAS LATER LEARNED TO BE BALLEYS NEPHEW AND WAS TURNED OVER CUSTODY TO A FAMILY MEMBER WHO ARRIVED ON SCENE). LIEUTENANT O'BRIEN, ALONG WITH OFFICERS ANITA MCKAY, SRIANNE VERRETT, JEFFREY CARRADINE, DWIGHT SALLER, AND SERGEANT STEPHANIE TAILLON ARRIVED ON SCENE. LIEUTENANT O'BRIEN CONFIRMED FROM OFFICER VITRANO THAT THE DRIVER WAS IN FACT WILLIAM BALLEY, LIEUTENANT O'BRIEN ALSO RECOGNIZED BAILEY FROM A DAV "THINKSTREAM" PRINTOUT WARCH WAS PART OF THE NIFORMATION REGARDING THE SEARCH WARRANT ON THE NISSAN MAXIMA (SEE ATTACHED OCCUMENTS).

OFFICER VITRANO PLACED THE SUBJECT IN HANDCUFFS BEHIND HIS BACK USING THE DOUBLE LOCK METHOD AND CONDUCTED A BRIEF OUTER CLOTHING PAT DOWN FOR WEAPONS, OFFICER VITRANO THEN ESCORTED BALLEY TO THE MARKED SUV (\$45037) OFFICER VITRANO PUT SAILEY IN THE REAR SEAT WITH A SEATBELT OVER HIS BODY. OFFICER VITRANO ADVISED BALLEY THAT LIEUTENANT O'SRIEN WOULD EXPLAIN THE INVESTIGATION TO HIM. OFFICER VITRANO ADVISED BALLEY OF HIS MIRANDA WARNINGS FROM A CARD, IN WHICH BALLEY STATED HE UNDERSTOOD BY SAYING "YES" AND AGREED TO WAIVE HIS RIGHTS, OFFICER VITRANO LATER INFORMED LIEUTENANT O'BRIEN THAT SAILEY UNDERSTOOD AND WANTED HIS RIGHTS.

WHILE ON SCENE, LIGUTEMANT O'BRIEN INSTRUCTED OFFICER MCKAY TO CHECK THE SMALL CHILD (BAILEY'S 6 YEAR OLD NEPHEW) BEFORE RELEASING CUSTODY. THE SEASON FOR THE SEARCH WAS QUE TO LIEUTEMANT O'BRIEN'S PRIOR EXPERIENCE IN NARCOTICS INVESTIGATIONS WHERE DRUG DEALERS WOULD CONCEAL CONTRABAND ON SMALL CHILDREN INTO CONTRABAND SEING FOLKS. WON'T SEARCH SMALL CHILDREN, OFFICER MCKAY SEARCHEOTHE SMALL CHILD WHICH YIELDED IN NO CONTRABAND SEING FOLKS. THE CHILD WAS THEN RELEASED CUSTODY TO A FAMILY MEMBER WHO ARRIVED ON SCENE, NOTE THE FAMILY MEMBER'S INFORMATION (JUNKNOWN BLACK FEMALE) WAS NOT WRITTEN KOWN, LIEUTENANT O'BRIEN BYSTRUCTED OFFICER VERRET, TO RELOCATE THE NISSAN MAXIMA TO THE MICHEST DISTRUCT STATION SALLYPORT LOCATED AT 501 NORTH RAMPART STREET, NOLA, OFFICER VERRETT RELOCATED THE YEARS ON AND PARKED TO WITH SALLYPORT.

OFFICER VITRANO TRANSPORTED BAILEY TO THE FIRST DISTRICT STATION WHERE HE WAS ESCORTED UPSTARS. LIEUTENANT O'BRIEN SHOWED THE SEARCH WARRANT TO BAILEY AND EXPLAINED THE INVESTIGATION TO HIM, LIEUTENANT O'BRIEN INFORMED BAILEY HE WOULD BE PROVIDED WITH A COPY OF THE SEARCH WARRANT WATH A HANDWRITTEN INVENTORY ON THE BEAR OF THE SEARCH WARRANT FOR ANY CONFISCATED ITEMS DURING THE BAYESTIGHTON BAILEY REMAINED IN THE LOBBY AREA OF THE FIRST DISTRICT WARRANT FOR ANY CONFISCATED HOME BY OFFICER VITRANO COMPLETED AN N.O.P.D. PRISONER STATION, ALLTHE WHILE BEING MONITORED BY OFFICER VITRANO MOTE THAT OFFICER VITRANO COMPLETED AN N.O.P.D. PRISONER LOG BOOK FOR BAILEY.

LIEUTENANT OBRIEN, ALONG WITH OFFICER VERRETT, CONDUCTED A FULL SEARCH OF THE NISSAN MAXIMA, AFTER APPROXMATELY AN HOUR INTO THE SEARCH, NO CONTRABAND WAS FOUND. THE VEHICLE WAS RELOCATED TO THE 1200 BLOCK OF SAINT LOUIS STREET BY OFFICER VERRETT, WHO LOCKED AND SECURED THE VEHICLE IN A LEGAL PARKING SPOT. OFFICER VERRETT LATER GAVE THE KEYS TO LIEUTENANT O'BRIEN, WHO THEN LATER GAVE THE KEYS BACK TO BALLEY BASED ON DIEUTENANT O'BRIENS PREVIOLS!

NIFORMATION ON BAILEY, IN ADDITION TO HIS EXPERIENCE IN STREET LEVEL IL LEGAL CRUIS ACTIVITY, LIEUTENANT O'BRIEN HAD A BIRONG REASON TO BELIEVE THAT BAILEY WAS CONCEALING CONTRABAND WITHIN HIS INNER CLOTHANG GARMENTS. BASED ON THAT, UPUT BRIEN DECIDED TO PERFORM A STREET SEARCH ON BAILEY PER N.O.P.D. POLICY, CHAPTER 1.2.A (SEE ATTACHED DOCUMENTS) AND A COPY WAS PROVIDED TO BAILEY.

LIEUTENANT O'BRIEN EXPLAINED TO BASLEY A STRIP SEARCH WOULD BE CONDUCTED IN ACCORDANCE TO N.O.P.D. POLICY.

LIEUTENANT C'BRIEN, ALONG WITH OFFICER VITRANO AND OFFICER ARTHUR CLEVELAND (DESK OFFICER) ESCORTED BAILEY INTO THE

MENS LOCKER ROOM OF THE FIRST DISTRICT STATION. OFFICER VITRANDS BODY WORN CAMERA WAS STILL ACTIVATED FROM THE

ORIGINAL TRAFFIC STOR AND OFFICER CLEVELAND UTILIZED AN N.O.P.D. DEPARTMENTAL DIGITAL CAMERA IN RECORD MODE DURING

THE ESCORT AND SUBSECUENT SEARCH OF BAILEY.

WHILE INSIDE THE LOCKER ROOM, LIEUTENANT O'BRIEN RETERATED TO BALLY THE REASONS WHY A STRIP SEARCH WAS TO BE CONDUCTED. LIEUTENANT O'BRIEN FORM THAT BALLEY WAS IN POSSESSION OF VARIOUS DENOMINATIONS OF CURRENCY INSIDE HIS RIGHT REAR PANTS POCKET. THE CURRENCY WAS COUNTED BY OFFICER VITRANO (8612.00) IN THE PRESENCE OF BALLEY. A MONEY RECEIPT WAS LATER COMPLETED BY OFFICER VITRANO (SEE ATTACHED DOCUMENTS) AND COPY WAS SUPPLIED TO BAILEY. RECEIPT WAS LATER COMPLETED BY OFFICER VITRANO (SEE ATTACHED DOCUMENTS) AND IT TO BRIEN HIS HEPHEW TO GET A HAIR CUT. LIEUTENANT O'BRIEN ASKED BALLEY ABOUT THE CURRENCY, BALLEY STATED HE WAS ABOUT TO BRIENS HIS HEPHEW TO GET A HAIR CUT. LIEUTENANT O'BRIEN QUESTIONED BALLEY ABOUT THE REASONS WHY HE HAD THAT AMOUNT OF CURRENCY ON HIS PERSON, IN WHICH BALLEY GAVE HESITANT AND INDECISIVE ANSWERS WHICH FURTHERED LIEUTENANT O'BRIEN'S HELDER THAT THE MONEY WAS FROM ALLEGAL, DRUG BALLES BY BALLEY.

LIBUTEMANT OBRIEN CONTINUED TO SEARCH BARLEY WHILE USING A HANDIHED STARSHLIGHT, ALL THE WHILE BEING RECORDED ON OFFICER VITRANO'S BODY WORK CAMERA AND THE DIGITAL RECORDER HELD BY OFFICER CLEYSLAND. AS LIEUTEMANT O'BRIEN PULLED BACK THE REAR PORTION OF THE INNER BOXER SHORTS WORN BY BAILEY, HE (O'BRIEN) COULD CLEARLY SEE IN PLANT VIEW A PECE OF CLEAR PLASTIC PAPER BICKING OUT APPROXIMATELY A PRECE OF CLEAR PLASTIC PAPER BICKING OUT FROM BETWEEN BAILEY'S BUTTOCKS. THE PAPER WAS STICKING OUT APPROXIMATELY A HALF-INCH, UPON OBSERVING THE PLASTIC PAPER, LIEUTEMANT O'BRIEN BAILEY'S BUTTOCKS. LIEUTEMANT O'BRIEN REMOVED THE PLASTIC WITH HIS RIGHT HAND AND INMEDIATELY OBSERVED IT WAS A SMALL CLEAR WRAPPED BAG CONTAINING WHAT APPEARED TO BE SEVERAL SMALL PIECES OF CRACK COCAME, LIEUTEMANT O'BRIEN DROPPED THE BAG ON THE LOCKER ROOM FLOOR AND INSTRUCTED OFFICER CLEVELAND TO RECORD THE BAG. THE DIGITAL DESTRUCTED OFFICER CLEVELAND TO RECORD THE BAG. THE DIGITAL RECORDING OF THE SECORT AND SUBSEQUENT SEARCH OF BAILEY WAS LATER PUT ONTO A BISC AND PLACED INTO THE FIRST DISTRICT STATION CENTRAL EVIDENCE AND PROPERTY DROPBOX BY LIEUTEMANT O'BRIEN (SEE ATTACHED DOCUMENTS). LIEUTEMANT O'BRIEN AND OFFICER ON HAS PERSON. AT THAT PORT, LIEUTEMANT O'BRIEN AND OFFICER O'BRIEN AND O'BRIEN AND OFFICER O'BRIEN AND O'BRIEN AND O'BRIEN AND O'FFICER O'BRIEN O'BRIEN AND O'FFICER O'BRIEN O'

VISUALLY CHECKED UNDER BALEY'S GENTIALS FOR ANY ADDITIONAL CONTRABAND, IN WHICH NO FURTHER CONTRABAND WAS FOUND. LIEUTENANT O'BRIEN DID NOT TOUCH SAILEY'S GENTIALS, NOR CONDUCT A BODY CAVITY SEARCH AT ANY TIME DURING THE STRIP SEARCH, NOTE THAT PRIOR TO THE SEARCH, LIEUTENANT O'BRIEN EXPLAINED TO BAILEY THAT A BODY CAVITY SEARCH WOULD NOT BE CONDUCTED, DUE TO A SEARCH WARRANT BEING NEEDED, OFFICER VITRANO'S BODY WORN CAMERA AND THE DISTAL RECORDER UTFLIZED BY OFFICER CLEVELAND RECORDED WHAT LIEUTENANT O'BRIEN SAID TO BAILEY, LIEUTENANT O'BRIEN, AT A LATER DATE, WATCHED THE RECORDING ON OFFICER VITRANO'S BODY WORN CAMERA.

BALLEY WAS THEN ESCORTED OUT OF THE MENS LOCKER ROOM AND SEATED ON A CHAIR INSIDE THE LOBBY AREA. OFFICER VITRANO COMPLETED A RIGHTS OF ARRESTEE FORM (#261328, SEE ATTACHED DOCUMENTS), IN WHICH SALLEY REPUSED TO SIGN AND WRITE ANY REMARKS, A COPY OF THAT FORM WAS LATER PROVIDED TO BAILEY. THE SAG CONTAINING THE CONTRABAND WAS FIELD TESTED BY OFFICER VITRANO AND LIEUTENANT O'BRIEN, WHICH SHOWED A POSITIVE RESULT FOR COCAINE (SEE ATTACHED DOCUMENTS). LIEUTENANT O'BRIEN CONDUCTED A HANDWRITTEN INVENTORY OF THE CONFISCATED ITEMS ON THE REAR OF THE SEARCH WARRANT WHICH WAS EXPLAINED AND PROVIDED TO BAILEY. A COPY OF THE HANDWRITTEN INVENTORY IS INCLUDED IN THE ATTACHED DOCUMENTS SECTION.

LIEUTENANT O'BRIEN COMPLETED A HANDWRITTEN ARREST GIST (SEE ATTACHED DOCUMENTS), WHICH WAS REVIEWED AND SIGNED BY GERGEANT STEPHANIE TAILLON (LINIT 130-A), SERGEANT TAILLON ALSO ASSISTED LIEUTENANT O'BRIEN IN PREPARING THE INTEROPPICE CORRESPONDENCE FOR THE STRIP SEARCH POLICY.

OFFICER VITRANO COMPLETED A TRAFFIC AFFIDAVIT CHARGING BALLEY WITH TRAFFIC VIOLATIONS OF NO SEAT BELT AND NO CHILD RESTRAINT. THE AFFIDAVIT WAS REVIEWED AND SIGNED BY LIEUTENANT OBRIEN (SEE ATTACHED DOCUMENTS).

AFTER ALL THE PRELIMINARY PAPERWORK WAS COMPLETED, AT APPROXIMATELY 2/30 P.M. (9/23/2017), OFFICER VITRANC ESCORTED BAILEY DOWNSTAIRS (HANDCUFFED IN FRONT OF HIS BODY) AND PLACED HIM IN THE REARLOF FULLY MARKED SUVETISHT AND SECURED A SEATBELT OVER HIS BODY. NOTE THAT SAKEY NOUTRED ABOUT HIS CELL PHONE WHILE IN THE LOSEY AREA PRICE TO BEING ESCORTED TO THE DOWNSTAIRS SALLYPORT, LIEUTENANT OBRIEN RECALLED PLACING THE CELL PHONE, ON THE FRONT PASSENGER SIDE AREA OF THE MISSAN WHILE CONDUCTING THE VEHICLE SEARCH, LIEUTENANT OBRIEN INFORMED BAILEY THAT OFFICER VITRANO WOULD MAKE ARRANGEMENTS FOR HIM TO RETRIEVE HIS PROME. THE NISSAN WAS LEFT AT THAT LOCATION LOCKED AND SECURED IN A LEGAL PARKING SPOT, OFFICER VITRANO THEN TRANSPORTED BAILEY TO CRIEANS PARSH CENTRAL LOCK-UP WHERE BAILEY WAS BOOKED WITH LOUISMAN STATE CHARGES OF R.S. 40:367, RELATIVE TO POSSESSION WITH INTENT TO DISTRIBUTE A SCHEDULE TWO CONTROLLED DANSEROUS SUBSTANCE WHILE IN THE PRESENCE OF A MINOR (6 YEAR OLD CHILD) AND TRAFFIC CHARGES OF NO SEAT SELT (R.S. 52:285.1) AND NO CHILD RESTRAINT SEAT (R.G. 52:295).

LIEUTENANT C'ERIEN PLACED THE CURRENCY AND CRACK COCAINE (S.1 GRANS) ON THE BOOKS AS EVIDENCE AT N.O.P.D. CENTRAL EVIDENCE AND PROPERTY LOCATED AT 1116 MAGNOLIA STREET, NOLA (SEE ATTACHED DOCUMENTS).

NOTE THAT DURING THE INITIAL INVESTIGATION PRIOR TO THE SEARCH WARRANT, LIEUTENANT OBRIEN RESEARCHED BALLEY VIA THE N.O.P.D. FIELD INTERVIEW OATABASE AND LEARNED HE WAS ENTERED BY OFFICER CALVIN ROGOTH ON 89/2017 (SEE ATTACHED DOCUMENTS). ALSO NOTE THAT LIEUTENANT OBRIEN COMPLETED A RETURN ON SEARCHWARRANT (SEE ATTACHED DOCUMENTS) WHICH WAS HAND DELIVERED TO MAGISTRATE COURT ON 8/28/2017 BY OFFICER VITRAND.
